Wine: A symbol of human joy.

Fragrant Spices: During Shabbat we were granted an extra soul. Spices help console our soul, for the loss of the extra soul when the week begins.

Multi-wick Flame: Traditionally we do not light fire during Shabbat. We now can work, and dispel darkness. Note the multi-wick flame. Our lives come together to make the world a brighter place.

[We try to see the reflection of the flame in our fingernails, and the shadow of our fingers in the palm of our hand - these represent the first instances of work we do after Shabbat is over.]

Separation / Distinction: Note how all of the senses are involved in letting go of Shabbat: seeing and smelling wine; smelling, seeing and hearing spices; seeing the light and feeling the warmth of the light; tasting the wine; seeing the light; hearing the flame extinguished.

[We finally drink the wine we blessed earlier. We then extinguish the flame using the wine.]
