There are many words in Hebrew that do not have an exact English equivalent. Some Hebrew words can mean many different things in English. For example, the word עוֹרְבָּע introduced in this chapter means both endless time (eternity) and endless space (universe). It can also mean world. The word 701 can be translated as grace or goodness, as well as lovingkindness. In the vocabulary lists of this book, we will try to give a one or two word translation that best sums up the meaning of each word. You should be aware, however, that the words could be translated in many different ways.

Adjectives as Nouns

You have already learned that the Hebrew adjective is used to describe nouns. The adjective can also be used alone, as a noun. It is then translated the . . . one.

He is the good one.

They are the holy ones.

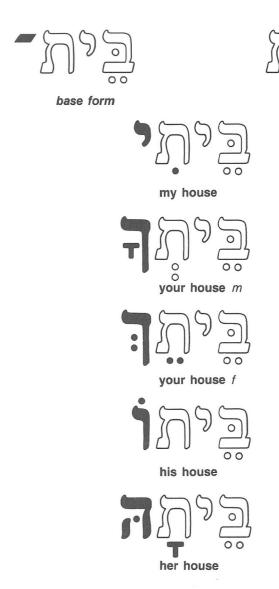

Possessive Endings for Hebrew Nouns

English shows possession by using separate words such as <u>my</u>, <u>your</u>, <u>his</u>, and <u>her</u>. Possession is shown in Hebrew by attaching special endings to nouns. In this chapter you will learn the Hebrew endings that mean <u>my</u>, <u>your</u>, <u>his</u>, and <u>her</u>, and how they are attached to singular nouns.

We will call the form of the noun to which endings are attached the *base form*. The letters of the base form are the same as the letters of the noun. The vowels of the base form may be the same as those of the original noun, or they may be different. The vowels of the base form of most nouns remain the same no matter which ending is attached.

In the following pages we will give you many examples of nouns with possessive endings. The examples are included only to help you recognize the possessive endings and the base forms to which they are attached. You do not need to memorize each word.



- Notice that there is a masculine ending your and a feminine ending your X.
- The dot in the 7 is part of the spelling of the her ending.
- The form לוֹנְי (your m) also appears as אוֹנְי (for example בּינוֹךְי).

Examples of Nouns with Possessive Endings

Many nouns change their vowels when the possessive endings are attached.
